The following House Files were introduced:

Rasmusson introduced:

H. F. No. 2610, A bill for an act relating to retirement; volunteer firefighter relief associations; requiring special fund assets to be invested with the State Board of Investment; requiring an investment portfolio review; revising the investment disclosure requirement for volunteer firefighter relief associations; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 356.645; 356.646; 356A.06, subdivision 5; 424A.095.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State Government Finance and Elections.

H. F. No. 2611, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for a regional trail segment in Maplewood State Park; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Robbins introduced:

H. F. No. 2612, A bill for an act relating to health; providing for informed consent for pelvic examinations of an anesthetized or unconscious patient; establishing a penalty; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 145.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 2613, A bill for an act relating to state lands; providing for conveyance of certain surplus state land.
