My name is Joyce A. Berglund, and I have been a licensed family child care provider for over 15 years. I am also a dedicated advocate for early childhood education, a mother, and a foster-to-adopt parent. I am writing to express my strong support for HF655 and HF633, which take essential steps toward strengthening the family child care system in Minnesota.

HF655, authored by Rep. Zeleznikar, proposes a crucial amendment to family child care capacity limits by ensuring that two of a provider's own children do not count in the ratio.
