Effective for refunds based on property taxes payable in 2026 and thereafter.

EXPLANATION OF THE BILL

Under current law the copay percentages for homeowners claiming a property tax refund range from 12% to 47% depending on household income.

The proposal would lower the homeowner copay percentages by 5 percentage points for income ranges below \$52,960.

REVENUE ANALYSIS DETAIL

- The estimate is based on the February 2025 forecast.
- By lowering the copay percentages for homeowners, state-paid property tax refunds to homeowners would increase by \$18.0 million beginning in FY 2027.
- Under the proposal, approximately 29% of homeowner PTR claimants would receive an increased refund, with the average refund increase being \$104.

Number of Taxpayers: 174,000 homeowner PTR claimants would receive an increased refund.
