

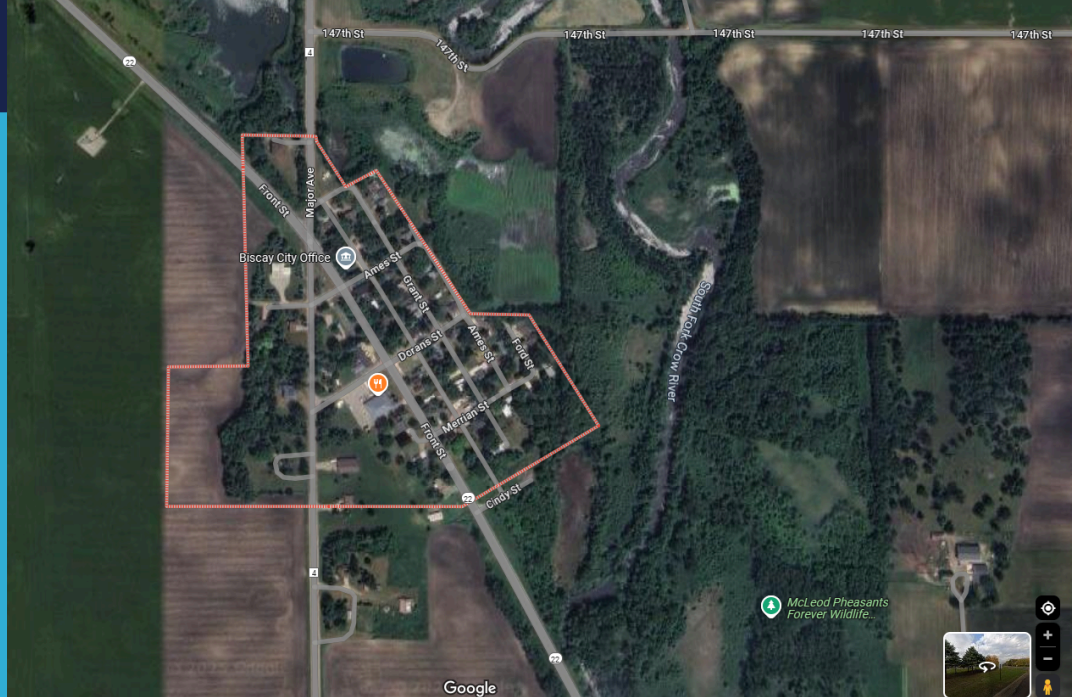
# City of Biscay

## For the potable water needs of its residents and businesses, ensuring public health and safety

### The Need

The City of Biscay's water system has extremely rusty water and is old in need of replacement, including its well, treatment, storage, and distribution system. With the limited existing taxbase of only 48 households and 1 business, the City can't afford these necessary, life sustainable improvements.

The existing water system is over 80 years old and dilapidated. There are numerous unknowns about how much longer it will continue to work without the proposed project. **Potable water is a base necessity for the health and wellbeing of our community and its' residents.**

### The Project

The city proposes to replace its well with a water tower and additional treatment to the current well, replace the old treatment facility equipment with current equipment, and replace the old water pipes distribution system.

Our work would include the pre-design, planning, design and construction of this project. We have not completed a feasibility study yet as our request for capital will determine whether or not we move forward with the project.

### Funding Requested

**\$3,000,000**

The City of Biscay is requesting \$3M in bonding bill assistance, which with the small size of the community would fund 91% of the project cost. The remaining project cost will be funded by local sources.

Without assistance, the cost would be **\$68,750 per connection**

### Project Benefits

The City of Biscay's water system is extremely old and in need of replacement, including its well, treatment, storage and distribution system. Water is the basic need for human health and wellbeing. Without this project, the City, its' residents and business will struggle to exist.
