



# New Hope Village Golf Course

# A fixture of the community. A regional asset.

The New Hope Village Golf Course is a public nine-hole, par three, 27-acre golf course. Initially opened in the 1960s by private investors, the City of New Hope purchased the course in 1971.

The New Hope Village Golf Course offers affordable golf opportunities for all ages and abilities. The beautifully managed and maintained course draws golfers from throughout the Twin Cities metro area.

# **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

### **IRRIGATION**

The existing irrigation system dates back to the 1960s, with some components replaced over time. Due to the age of the piping, there are numerous failed or failing glue connections, plastic elbows and tees, shut-off (isolation) valves and quick couplers. Many sprinkler heads do not operate properly or effectively, leading to water loss and inefficient usage. Water conservation is critical; golf courses must prioritize efficient water use and conservation measures. Proposed improvements include replacing 17,350 feet of irrigation pipe, installing 270 new sprinkler heads, and implementing a new computerized central controller.

#### **PAVED CART PATHS**

Golf cart usage has increased significantly on the course. The existing gravel cart paths have developed numerous potholes, leading to safety concerns for riders, potential damage to the golf carts, and harm to the turf that is used as an alternative path when the gravel paths become impassable. To address these issues, we propose replacing 4,050 square feet of the current gravel path with a bituminous surface and adding an additional 2,040 square feet of new path.

#### **COLD STORAGE**

A new cold storage structure will extend the life of golf carts and other equipment while providing enhanced security. This 30'x40' facility will accommodate golf carts, turf maintenance tools, and various other equipment. The existing maintenance shop was originally built when the course had only two golf carts. Currently, the course operates a fleet of 18 carts.
