### Overview

This bill appropriates money for the judicial branch and makes technical changes to certain filing requirements.

## Summary

Section	Description
1	<b>Deputy sheriff and court administrator; St. Louis County.</b> Removes the limitation on filing papers with the deputy court administrator in relation to proceedings in Duluth.
2	<b>Papers where filed; St. Louis County.</b> Eliminates the requirement that certain papers must be filed in specific locations in St. Louis County and authorizes filing at any court in the county.
3	<b>Requirement.</b> Removes the provision limiting certain orders related to divorce proceedings to two pages.
4	<b>Reports; appointment of visitor; monitoring; court orders.</b> Requires reports of conservators to be provided to the person subject to conservatorship and to other interested persons of record.
5	<b>Judiciary appropriations.</b> Appropriates money to the supreme court, court of appeals, and district courts to maintain operations, provide access to information for justice partners, improve digital accessibility, improve cyber security, increase the rate of pay for forensic examiners, increase juror per diem and mileage rates, provide mandated psychological services, provide interpreter services, and support other jury services.
