


## **History Programs and Education**


## **Northern Lights**

#### **Historic Sites Network**

- Statewide Presence of History
   Where It Happened
- Defined in statutes in M.S. 138.662
- Includes many of the state's most significant historic sites, including 150+ structures for which MNHS is responsible
- Important part of tourism economy -many out-of-state visitors
- Educational and affordable destination for families and school groups



# The Minnesota Historical Society holds for the people of Minnesota, current and future generations:

- 342,168 photographs
- 503,107 publications
- 6,7761 works of art
- 249,213 objects



- 65,000 cubic feet in State Archives, including 100 terabytes of digital records
- 6.6 million pages of digitized newspapers








## **Number of People Served**

- More than 850,000
   in-person visits to historic
   sites and museums
- Includes nearly 200,000 schoolchildren on organized programs to historic sites and museums
- Over 5 million visits to the Society's website www.mnhs.org



# Statewide History Involvement and Participation

- 19,000 participants in History Day (many national award winners from Minnesota)
- 19,216 members
- Volunteers and staff make this all happen!
  - Nearly 1000 volunteers and interns contributing 19,000 hours
  - o 400 FTE MNHS employees






#### FY 2024 Budget (All Funds)



#### **MNHS Expenses Overview**


# Salaries & Benefits account for approximately 50% of total expenses

Benefits costs are approximately 40% of salaries

# Other Expenses include all other items

- Other expenses includes pass through items such as grants and MN History Center building expense
- Utilities, repairs, professional/technical services, marketing, equipment, etc.

## **MNHS - 2025 Session Budget Request**

#### **Operating Budget**

**Base Budget - General Fund:** \$23.9 million each year

- For staffing, operational costs
- Supplemented by earned revenue, contributions

#### MNHS - 2025 Session Budget Request


# Operating Budget Base Budget - General Fund: \$23.9 million each year

Governor's budget recommendation:
Operating Adjustment
\$306,000 (FY26) + \$619,000 (FY27) = \$925,000

#### **Emerging Challenges, Needs and Opportunities**

- Post-pandemic return to full service to Minnesotans
- Sustainability (Increasing costs and flat revenues all sources)
