I would like to voice my concern in strongly opposing the proposed language in the Omnibus Bill in regard to "proof of prior testing plan" and a "copy of the official test scores".

There is credible evidence to suggest that a change in homeschool standardized testing reporting requirements is unnecessary or useful .At that time, the school districts also concluded that they did not want to receive and maintain unnecessary paperwork from homeschoolers - nor do homeschoolers need or want the additional paperwork.
