Drinking Water | Wastewater | Storm & Sewer Improvements



The City of Lambertton has been inching by with only one existing well, which is located on privately owned property. The current water source does not meet industry standards and only has a day and a half worth of supply in reserves if the “unthinkable” were to happen. Since 2017, the city has been without water multiple times, shutting down all residents, business, industry, school system, healthcare facilities, etc.

Project Scope

Water utility work needs total \$7.3 million. Due to Lambertton’s current investment of \$543,000, this project is shovel-ready and just waiting on the remaining funding.

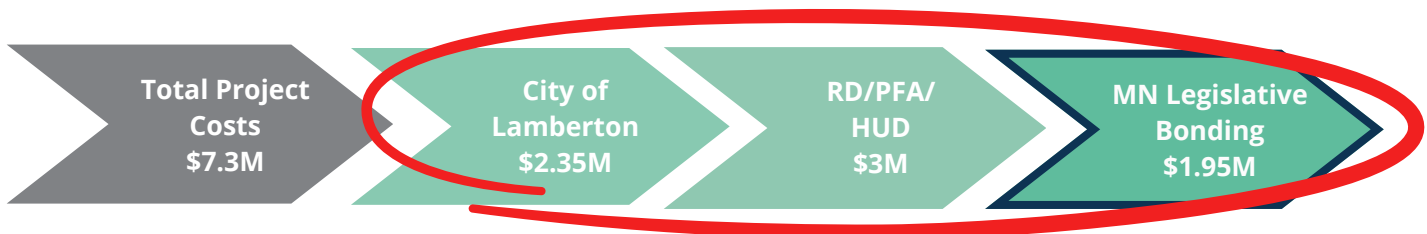
- Installation of new well and well house.

Project Affordability

- The population of Lambertton is 792 people.
- The median household income is \$56,250.
- 54.4% of the households are low to moderate income households.
- Residents average \$155/month in utility costs and will exceed an additional \$238/year without bonding support.
- As part of this project, the city will establish a reserve/replacement account.
