# **Overview**

This bill adjusts some speed thresholds, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, for implements of husbandry and other vehicles related to towing, use of taillights, slow-moving vehicle emblems, and load covering. Effective August 1, 2025.

# **Summary**

## Section Description

## 1 Implement of husbandry.

Increases the speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, at which a self-propelled vehicle used in livestock operations can be operated and treated as an implement of husbandry.

# 2 Requirements; exception.

Increases the speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, at which an implement of husbandry can be towed without taillights and license plate illumination being required.

## 3 **Displaying emblem; rules.**

Increases the upper designed operating speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, of various vehicles for which a slow-moving vehicle emblem is required to be displayed. Increases the top speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, at which an empty implement of husbandry can be towed without removing a slow-moving vehicle emblem.

## 4 Speed.

Increases the maximum allowed speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, when operating or towing an implement of husbandry.

# 5 Securing load; exceptions.

Increases the maximum allowed speed, from 30 to 35 miles per hour, in which trash or debris can be transported without the load being covered.
