

Subject Child care licensing; indication of self-report

Overview

This bill provides that the documentation of a licensing action issued to a licensed child care program (including a child care center and family child care provider) must include whether the license holder self-reported the conditions that led to the licensing action. The bill also provides that if the commissioner of children, youth, and families publicly posts documentation of a licensing action on the department's website, then the post must also indicate self-reporting.

Summary

Section	Description
1	Contents of correction orders and conditional licenses. Amends § 142B.16, subd. 1. Requires that a correction order or order of conditional license issued to a licensed child care program include whether the conditions that led to the licensing action were self-reported.
2	Posting orders on department website. Adds a subdivision to § 142B.16. Provides that if the commissioner of children, youth, and families publicly posts an order of conditional license or correction order issued to a licensed child care program, then the post must include whether the license holder self-reported the conditions that led to the licensing action.
3	Fix-it ticket. Amends § 142B.17, subd. 1. Requires that a fix-it ticket issued to a licensed child care program include whether the conditions that led to the ticket were self-reported.
4	Documented technical assistance. Amends § 142B.171, subd. 2. Requires that documented technical assistance provided to a licensed child care program under the weighted risk system indicate whether the conditions that led to the technical assistance were self-reported.

5	<p data-bbox="316 262 641 294">Indication of self-report.</p> <p data-bbox="316 304 1430 535">Adds a subdivision to § 142B.18. Requires that specified licensing orders issued to a licensed child care program indicate whether the conditions that led to the licensing action were self-reported. Provides that if the commissioner of children, youth, and families publicly posts a specified licensing order, then the post must include whether the license holder self-reported the conditions that led to the licensing action.</p>
