Overview

Clarifies that support being redirected from the obligee to another can be sent to the obligee when it meets one of the statutory factors finding redirection of child support is not in the child's best interest. This section would be effective on July 1, 2025.

Summary

Section Description

1 Administrative redirection of support.

Allows the agency to stop directing child support from the obligor to a public authority who is providing services to the child and send that support to the person who has custody of the child even when the child is out of the home when it is in the best interest of the child to do so.
